

Talent Attraction

Phase 2

Phase 2 of the campaign consists of a flexible recruitment and retention employee incentive program MCAC created to supplement the existing incentive programs currently available in our community.

These funds can be used to match employer-sponsored incentive programs such as tuition reimbursement, employee retention bonuses, down payment assistant programs, and more.

Funding is limited* and will be available on a first come, first served basis. Interested parties will sign up online beginning in early spring.



In 2024, Coffeyville Regional Medical Center will begin construction of a 12,000- square foot primary care facility to be located immediately south of the CRMC main campus on 4th Street in Coffeyville. The CRMC Primary Care Clinic, Pediatrics and Women's Health offices currently located at the north entrance of Coffeyville Regional Medical Center will be relocated to the new building.

The total project cost is \$8.1 million. The Build for the Future campaign will have several revenue streams, including:

- \$4 million through a Congressionally-directed grant.
- \$400,00 from the CRMC Foundation via its Bill Read Memorial Fund.
- \$165,000 through Kansas Income Tax Credits.

An additional boost to the "Build for the Future" campaign has come from the sons of retired pediatrician Chan S. Han. Han retired from CRMC in 2014. The three sons (Yong, Sam and Yun) have chosen to invest in their hometown by contributing \$1 for every \$2 that is donated to the CRMC Foundation's Build for the Future campaign. Through the Build with the Brothers Challenge, the Han brothers will contribute up to \$100,000. The Build with the Brothers Challenge ends March 31, 2024.




